"But at that time your people—everyone whose name is found written in the book—will be delivered. ² Multitudes who sleep in the dust of the earth will awake." -Dan 12:1-2

"Flee from sexual immorality. All other sins a man commits are outside his body, but he who sins sexually sins against his own body. ¹⁹ Do you not know that your body is a temple of the Holy Spirit, who is in you, whom you have received from God? You are not your own; ²⁰ you were bought at a price. Therefore honor God with your body."-1 Co 6:18-20.

The Christian's use of the body:

God's guide for the married.

The wife's body does not belong to her alone but also to her husband. In the same way, the husband's body does not belong to him alone but also to his wife. 1 Cor 7:4

God's guide for using Christian freedom in matters of the body (tattoos, piercings, consumption of alcohol, smoking.)

Be careful, however, that the exercise of your freedom does not become a stumbling block to the weak. ... ¹³ Therefore, if what I eat causes my brother to fall into sin, I will never eat meat again, so that I will not cause him to fall. 1 Cor 8:9,13

So whether you eat or drink or whatever you do, do it all for the glory of God. 32 Do not cause anyone to stumble 1 Co 10:31-32

How do you offer the body as a living sacrifice? Why?
