Instruction for the End of Lent

First Reading

Exodus 12:1-14

The Lord gave the people of Israel instructions for the first Passover.

The LORD told Moses and Aaron this in the land of Egypt:

²This month is to be the beginning of your calendar. It is to be the first month of the year for you. ³Tell the entire Israelite community that on the tenth day of this month, they are to take a lamb or a young goat for themselves, according to their fathers' households, one lamb per household.

⁴But if the household is too small for a whole lamb, then that person and his neighbor next door to him must select one, based on the number of people. Determine what size lamb is needed according to how much each person will eat.

⁵Your lamb must be unblemished, a year-old male. You may take it from the sheep or the goats. ⁶You are to keep it until the fourteenth day of this month. Then the whole assembly

of the Israelite community is to slaughter the lambs at sunset.⁷ They shall take some of the blood and put it on the two doorposts and the lintel of the houses where they eat the lamb.⁸ That night they shall eat the meat that has been roasted over a fire, along with unleavened bread. They shall eat it with bitter herbs.⁹ Do not eat it raw or boiled in water, but roasted over a fire—with its head, its legs, and its internal organs.¹⁰ You shall not leave any of it until the morning. Whatever remains until the morning, you shall burn in the fire.¹¹ This is how you are to eat it: with your cloak tucked into your belt ready for travel, your sandals on your feet, and your staff in your hand. Eat it in haste. It is the LORD's Passover.¹² For on that night I will pass through the land of Egypt. I will strike down every firstborn in the land of Egypt, both people and animals. Against all the gods of Egypt I will execute judgment. I am the LORD.¹³ The blood will be a sign for you on the houses where you are. When I see the blood, I will pass over you. There will be no plague

among you to destroy you when I strike down the land of Egypt.

¹⁴This day shall be a memorial for you, and you are to celebrate it as a festival to the LORD. Throughout your generations you must celebrate it as a permanent regulation.

Second Reading

1 Corinthians 11:23-28

The Lord gave the New Testament Church instructions for the Lord's Supper

For I received from the Lord what I also delivered to you: The Lord Jesus, on the night when he was betrayed, took bread,²⁴and when he had given thanks, he broke it and said, "This is my body, which is for you. Do this in remembrance of me."²⁵In the same way, after the meal, he also took the cup, saying, "This cup is the new testament in my blood. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me."²⁶For as often as you eat this bread and drink the cup, you proclaim the Lord's death until he comes.

²⁷Therefore whoever eats the bread or drinks the cup of the Lord in an unworthy manner will be guilty of sinning against the Lord's body and blood.²⁸Instead, let a person examine himself and after doing so, let him eat of the bread and drink from the cup.

Matthew 26:36-46

There is a striking contrast between Jesus' attitude of willing service and those he served.

Then Jesus went with them to a place called Gethsemane. He told his disciples, "Sit here, while I go over there and pray." ³⁷He took with him Peter and the two sons of Zebedee, and he began to be sorrowful and distressed. ³⁸Then he said to them, "My soul is very sorrowful, even to the point of death. Stay here, and keep watch with me."

³⁹He went a little farther, fell on his face, and prayed. He said, "My Father, if it is possible, let this cup

pass from me. Yet not as I will, but as you will."

⁴⁰He came to the disciples and found them sleeping. He said to Peter, "So, were you not able to stay awake with me for one hour?

⁴¹Watch and pray, so that you do not enter into temptation. The spirit is willing, but the flesh is weak."

⁴²He went away a second time and prayed, "My Father, if it is not possible for this cup to pass from me unless I drink it, may your will be done." ⁴³Again he returned and found them sleeping, because their eyes were heavy. ⁴⁴He left them again, went away, and prayed a third time. He said the same words as before. ⁴⁵Then he returned to his

disciples and said to them, "Are you still sleeping and resting? Look, the hour is near, and the Son of Man is betrayed into the hands of sinners.

Prayer of the Church

This prayer follows the three-part outline of Jesus' great High Priestly prayer. On the night before he died, Jesus prayed first for himself, then for his disciples, and finally for all believers (John 17).

Father in heaven, just as your Son lifted his eyes toward you on the night of his passion, we confidently approach you in his name as this day draws to a close.

I lift up my eyes to the hills. My help comes from the Lord.

As Priest and Passover Lamb, he prayed that his sacrifice, soon offered on the cross, would be acceptable to

you and would result in his glory and our salvation. We give you praise that, having finished the work you gave him to do, you answered his prayer.

At the name of Jesus, every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord to the glory of God the Father.

As ascending Advocate, he prayed for the disciples who believed his word and remained in the world. Preserve your saints here and in every place who bear your name through baptism. Though they are still in the world, keep them from

becoming of the world and protect them from its hatred.

Sanctify them by the truth, your word is truth.

Bless the instruction of the young. As you used the Passover celebration to teach Israel's youth, bless our frequent celebration of Holy Communion as opportunity and incentive to teach our children that they may soon share in it with us.

Whenever we eat the bread and drink the cup, we proclaim the Lord's death until he comes.

Finally, as Mediator for mankind, he prayed for those elect who were yet to be gathered. May the unity

created by your word and expressed in your Sacrament serve as clear evidence to the world that Christ is in us just as you are in him. Keep us from divisive error, needless disputes, and calloused indifference.

Because there is one loaf, we, who are many, are one body, for we all partake of the one loaf.

Use the apostolic gospel wherever it is preached to create and sustain faith. Just as Jesus now sits in glory, bring us and the full number of your chosen ones to the place where he has gone, which even now he makes ready for us.

Our citizenship is in heaven. And we eagerly await a Savior from there, the Lord Jesus Christ.

As he interceded for us then, we are confident that he intercedes for us now. Therefore, we ask these things in his name and pray as he taught us:

Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name, your kingdom come, your will be done on earth as in heaven. Give us today our daily bread. Forgive us our sins, as we forgive those who sin against us.
