Gathering Rite for Good Shepherd Sunday

CW 375 with Scripture Readings

For this is what the LORD God says. Here I am. I myself will seek the welfare of my flock and carefully search for them.

As a shepherd searches for his flock when his sheep that were with him have been scattered, so I will search for my flock and rescue them from all the places where they were scattered on a day of clouds and thick darkness. (Ezekiel 34)

Hear the word of the LORD, you nations. Declare it in the distant islands. He who scattered Israel will gather him and watch over him like a shepherd watching his flock. (Jeremiah 31)

The King of love my shepherd is, Whose goodness fails me never; I nothing lack if I am his, And he is mine forever.

We all have gone astray like sheep. **Each of us has turned to his own way.** (Isaiah 53)

Remember my affliction and my homeless wandering, the wormwood and bitterness. **My soul always remembers, and it has sunk within me.**

Nevertheless, I keep this in my heart.

This is the reason I have hope:

By the mercies of the Lord we are not consumed, for his compassions do not fail.

They are new every morning.

The Lord is good to those who wait for him, to the soul who seeks him.

It is good to hope quietly for the salvation of the Lord. (Lamentations 3)

The early church held the habit of gathering around the Word and Sacrament.

They continued to hold firmly to the apostles' teaching and to the fellowship, to the breaking of the bread, and to the prayers. ⁴³Awe came over every soul, and many wonders and signs were being done through the apostles. ⁴⁴All the believers were together and had everything in common. ⁴⁵They were selling their possessions and property and were distributing the proceeds according to what anyone needed.

Jesus is our Good Shepherd who calls us by name to guide, protect, and provide.

Amen, Amen, I tell you: Anyone who does not enter the sheep pen by the door, but climbs in by some other way, is a thief and a robber. ²The one who enters by the door is the shepherd of the sheep. ³The doorkeeper opens the door for him, and the sheep listen to his voice. He calls his own sheep by name and leads them out. ⁴When he has brought out all his own sheep, he walks ahead of them. The sheep follow him because they know his voice. ⁵They will never follow a stranger, but will run away from him, because they do not know the voice of strangers." ⁶Jesus used this illustration in speaking to the people, but they did not understand what he was telling them.

Confession of Faith

Using excerpts from Luther's Large Catechism, Second Article

If you are asked, "What do you believe in the Second Article, concerning Jesus Christ?" answer briefly:

"I believe that Jesus Christ, true Son of God, has become my Lord."

What is it to "become a Lord"? It means that he has redeemed me from sin, from the devil, from death, and from all evil.

Before this I had no Lord and King but was captive under the power of the devil. I was condemned to death and entangled in sin and blindness.

When we were created by God the Father, and had received from him all kinds of good things, the devil came and led us into disobedience, sin, death, and all evil.

We lay under God's wrath and displeasure, doomed to eternal damnation, as we had deserved.

There was no counsel, no help, no comfort for us until this only and eternal Son of God, in his unfathomable goodness, had mercy on our misery and wretchedness and came from heaven to help us. Those tyrants and jailers now have been routed, and their place has been taken by Jesus Christ, the Lord of life and righteousness and every good and blessing.

He has snatched us, poor lost creatures, from the jaws of hell, won us, made us free, and restored us to the Father's favor and grace. He has taken us as his own, under his protection, in order that he may rule us by his righteousness, wisdom, power, life, and blessedness.

Let this be the summary of this article, that the little word "Lord" simply means the same as Redeemer, that is, he who has brought us back from the devil to God, from death to life, from sin to righteousness, and now keeps us safe there. The remaining parts of this article simply serve to clarify and express how and by what means this redemption was accomplished — that is, how much it cost Christ and what he paid and risked in order to win us and bring us under his dominion.

That is to say, he became man, conceived and born without sin, of the Holy Spirit and the Virgin, that he might become Lord over sin; moreover, he suffered, died, and was buried that he might make satisfaction for me and pay what I owed, not with silver and gold but with his own precious blood.

All this in order to become my Lord. For he did none of these things for himself, nor had he any need of them.

Afterward he rose again from the dead, swallowed up and devoured death, and finally ascended into heaven and assumed dominion at the right hand of the Father.

Lord God, our maker and preserver, we praise and thank you for all that you give us day after day.

We are not worthy of all the mercies you show us.

You have given us your precious Word to nourish our souls and to protect us from the temptations of the devil, the world, and our sinful nature.

We thank you for those who teach and preach your saving truth at this place and everywhere. Grant them a rich measure of patience, wisdom, and love.

Heavenly Father, we pray that you shield us from every kind of danger: sudden catastrophe, terrors of crime, and the pain of disease. Watch over those who travel by land, sea, and air. Keep our loved ones from whatever perils may threaten them.

Heal those who are sick, cheer those who are sad, calm those who are distressed, and comfort all who are old and infirm.

Bless our land, our people, and those who hold offices of high trust. Keep our government and schools upright and strong for the advancement of good citizenship and useful vocations, that we may enjoy your gifts of peace, security, and well-being.

Grant your blessing to every nation on earth. Where there are wars, may there be peace. Where there is hatred, let it be healed. Where there is poverty, danger, or disaster, come with your almighty power to help and restore.
