The LORD your God will raise up for you a prophet like me from among you, from your brother Israelites. Listen to him.



Second Lesson

Hebrews 3:1-6

We confess Jesus as our great high priest.

Therefore, holy brothers, who share in the heavenly calling, focus your attention on Jesus, the apostle and high priest whom we confess. ²He was faithful to the one who appointed him, as also Moses was faithful in God's whole house. ³In fact, Jesus is worthy of greater glory than Moses, in the same way that the builder of a house has more honor than the house. ⁴For every house is built by someone, and God is the one who built everything.

⁵Moses was faithful as a servant within God's whole house by testifying to the things that would be spoken. ⁶But Christ is faithful as a Son over God's house. We are his house, if we hold on firmly to our confidence and the hope about which we boast until the end.

Jesus our great King came with authority over all evil.

²⁵Jesus rebuked the spirit, saying, "Be quiet! Come out of him!"


