Explain what is meant by "the Lord's name" and how we are to honor it today.


"Now ASK FOR GOD'S FAVOR"

(1:9) Israel still expected to receive God's favor even as they displayed contempt for the Lord and defiled his altar. Share other examples of this type of attitude.

My covenant with him was life and peace, which I gave to him. It was a covenant of reverence, and he revered me. He respected my name.

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Our Father is Faithful (2:10-3:12)

How have we wearied him?

(2:10-11) In what sense is God the Father of all? Explain how the Lord is the Father of all, but there are still "daughters of foreign gods." בַּת־אֵל נֵבֶר [Note the NIV 2011 translates this phrase differently from most other translations].

(2:11-17) Describe Judah's unfaithfulness and how the Lord responded.

Do we not all have one Father? Did not one God create us?

(3:1-5) Describe what it will be like when the Lord comes and what he will accomplish. Explain how this is fulfilled in Christ.

(3:6-7) God is faithful. His people were not. Explain what Judah's history teaches us about human nature and our condition without the gospel.

(3:8-12) God challenges the people of Judah to test his goodness. So, he attaches a promise of blessing for those who honor him. Some people today wrongly treat this as a get-rich plan. Explain why that would be an abuse of Scripture.


Share some of the blessings which believers in the New Testament Church are promised by God's rich grace when we honor him.

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Our Father Spares Us from Destruction (3:13-4:6)

What have we said against you?

(3:13-15) Identify the issue which caused the people to speak against the Lord.

List at least three biblical examples when it appeared like the wicked prospered and the righteous suffered.

You will again see the distinction between the righteous and the wicked, between those who serve God and those who do not.

-Mal 3:18

Share some of the ways you have witnessed how it might sometimes appear like there is no clear distinction between those who serve God and those who do not.

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(3:16) What point is there in worshipping the Lord? Share some of the blessings you have found whenever faithful believers gather for worship.

The Lord spares those who fear him.

(3:17-18) The Lord will make clear the difference between the righteous and the wicked. Expand on how the Day of Judgment will lead to each description:

- "Treasured possession" (Dt. 7:6; 1 Pe 2:9)
- "Spared" by God (Ps 103:10-13)

(4:1-3) Describe what will happen on Judgement Day and rate the severity of division between the righteous and the wicked.

How great the Father's love for us!

Explain how the Day of the Lord will be both "great and fearful."

(4:4-6) The Lord sent his servants to prepare hearts for his coming. How does he continue to prepare us for his coming?

Review what Malachi reveals about our Father's great love.

Review the seven questions the people had asked, and share some ways we can honor our faithful and merciful Father.

See Titus 2:11-14 to see what things currently make all believers distinct from unbelievers.

Read Luke 1:11-17 & Matthew
17:10-13 to find out how this
prophecy was fulfilled.
